1.1 OBJECTIVES OF THE CANADIAN DISC DOG ASSOCIATION

The Canadian Disc Dog Association is a non-profit sanctioning body established for the following purpose:

- To promote the sport of Disc Dog in Canada
- Establish rules of competition.
- Register and maintain records of competing dogs.
- Tabulate and issue titles earned by registered dogs
- Develop and certify judges.

1.2 ORGANIZATION & STRUCTURE

- The Canadian Disc Dog Association (CDDA) has an executive council and regional coordinators.
- The executive council consists of the following executive positions:

Executive director Trial sanctioning Titles and Awards Judges Website

- The executive director and executive council may add or remove positions as needed.
- Each region (Maritimes, Quebec, Ontario, And Western Canada) has a regional coordinator to promote the CDDA and answer enquiries from local competitors.
- All regional coordinators and executive positions report to the Executive director.
- Regional coordinators and executive members are appointed.
- Candidates are selected by the executive director based on recommendations from the executive council.
- The executive council meets once a year or as needed to discuss issues, policy and rule changes.
- Competitors are invited to submit written comments or suggestions to the CDDA for consideration by the executive.
- The CDDA sanctions trials. The CDDA does not host trials.

1.3 REGISTRATION AND ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

- A one-time fee is required to register each dog.
- Each dog must be registered
- Each dog's competition number must accompany all registrations for trials so that qualifying legs and points earned can be attributed to the right dog.
- All dogs must have a CDDA number before competing at any CDDA sanctioned trial.
- Each dog that has a CDDA competition number is eligible to for points and titles.
- Dogs that are 15 inches tall and under must be measured to compete in the mini-disc events.
- Dogs must be a minimum of 1 year old to compete in all classes except the RPT.
- The CDDA competition number represents one dog. A dog cannot have more than one competition number.

1.4 APPROVED DISCS

Any Hero, Hyperflyte or Fastback Disc that is designed to be use by canines may be use in CDDA sanctioned trials.

There can be no tampering, markings or alterations of any kind to the disc.

Disc Classifications

Disc cannot exceed the following sizes: Standard Disc - 8.5 - 9.5" diameter Mini Disc - 6.25 - 7" diameter

1.5 HANDLER EXCLUSIONS

Professional Handlers

Dogs cannot be handled by professional handlers for points, qualifiers or awards. A handler will be considered a professional handler if they do not own the dog and they are handling and are receiving money, gifts, services or other types of remuneration for handling the dog.

1.6 CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP

- If the ownership of a CDDA registered dog has changed the new owner should send the new information to the CDDA. The dog's number will not change.
- Any titles, points and qualifiers previously earned by the dog will stand.
